SFCC SEEKING VOLUNTEERS TO HELP WITH FEB 21ST "CLEAN UP" DAY

The Shepherd Forest Civic Club Beautification Committee has been busy organizing a "CLEAN UP" day on Sunday, February 21st from 2 to 4 pm and we need volunteers to help. The focus of the work will be picking up trash and litter in designated areas throughout Shepherd Forest. Residents are asked to report to the nearest "meet up" location at 2pm and get their specific assignment. "Meet up" locations are as follows:



- Section One – Meet on Alba near the Centerpoint Easement north of 31st
- Section Two – Meet near the drainage ditch along Oak Forest near Stonecrest
- Section Three – Meet near the intersection of Vollmer and West 34th

The Clean Up Day Team has pinpointed several specific areas in the neighborhood that are in need of having trash and debris picked up and they will be the focus of the Clean Up Day. The targeted areas in need of clean up include: the south side of West 34th (just west of the bayou & along the backside of some Section 3 homes), along West TC Jester and East TC Jester as they intersect the Shepherd Forest neighborhood, the City owned drainage ditches that run along Oak Forest between Stonecrest and West 34th, along Alba near the Centerpoint Easement, and the 610 Feeder Rd near Alba.



Volunteers are asked to bring their own gloves, rakes, clippers, grabbers.....or whatever equipment they feel would be helpful with this project. Garbage bags will be provided by the civic club. Please remember to wear appropriate clothing, hats, shoes, sunscreen, and bug repellent. TOO MUCH GARBAGE??

Do you often have more trash than one garbage container can hold? It's easy to get another garbage can. Just call 3-1-1, the City's Helpline, to have another container delivered to your address. There



is a monthly collection charge of \$18.33 for each can that you order and the fee is added to your monthly water bill. You will receive a sticker for the new can. Simply place the sticker on the front of the new

container where it can be easily seen by the garbage collectors and then wheel your new can to the curb.

If you don't need another can, but sometimes have extra bags of garbage that don't fit into your black curbside garbage container, you can get "Tags" for your additional bags and/or boxes. The City of Houston has a program called "Tags for Bags" that allows you to have your excess garbage picked up. "Tags" (stickers) can be purchased from participating Sellers Bros and Kroger stores and then affixed to your extra bag before placing it curbside. The cost is \$2.41 per tag with a minimum purchase of 5 tags. Tags for Bags are also available by calling the City of Houston at 3-1-1 and placing an order.

REMINDER

All residents in Shepherd Forest are again reminded that they **are bound by the current Deed Restrictions for each Section of Shepherd Forest.** Current Deed Restrictions require residents that are planning construction, remodeling, major repairs to first submit their plans to the SFCC Architectural Committee for approval. If you missed the virtual January SFCC meeting, you missed some important City curbside recycling information as well as some surprising recycling do's and don't's. Here's the scoop....

Residents were told that the City **WILL RECYCLE** the following in your green recycle cart that is placed curbside on your designated recycle day (every other week):

- * Kitchen, laundry & bath bottles and containers
- * Mixed paper, mail, newspaper, magazines, and flattened clean cardboard
- * Glass bottles and jars – empty and rinsed out
- * Food and beverage cartons - empty & rinsed out
- * Aluminum & steel cans – empty and rinsed out

The City **WILL NOT RECYCLE** the following if it is placed in your curbside recycling cart:

- * Shredded paper of any size
- * Tanglers - Hoses, wires, chains,, or electronics
- * Household items or furniture (drop off only)
- * Plastic newspaper bags (Newspapers yes, but not the bag it comes in)
- * Scrap metal or wood
- * Food containers (ex: fast food boxes)
- * Batteries or electronics (drop off only)
- * Plastic grocery bags (return them to the store)



Most recyclable items have a number on the bottom or side. **The City accepts anything with numbers 1-5 or number 7.** They DO NOT accept items marked with a number 6.

Your green recycle bin should not contain ANY trash or garbage.....only empty and clean recyclable items such as those listed above. The City loses money every time garbage is mixed with recycle items, so keep your trash out of your green recycle bin. When trash is mixed in the green bins, NONE of the items are recycled – instead it all goes to the garbage dump.

The City also provides six neighborhood recycle facilities where residents may dispose of Junk/Tree Waste and other common recyclable materials. For more information you may call the City Hotline at 311 or contact the City's Recycle Representative, Alyce Coffee, at 713-504-7438.

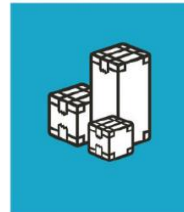

GOODBYE TO LUBY'S

According to SEC filings earlier this, Luby's Cafeteria is expected to cease restaurant operations by the end of their fiscal year in August, 2021. The West 34th location manager said the fate of the beloved



cafeteria is "still uncertain," but according to the SEC filing, "liquidation is imminent." Barring a last minute sale, it appears that the iconic Luby's may only be around for a short while.
