2021 HURRICANES START EARLY

The Atlantic hurricane season extends from June 1 to November 30th, but the first named storm (Tropical Storm Ana) for 2021 formed near Bermuda in late May. Although experts don't anticipate the historic level of storm activity seen in 2020, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Climate Prediction Center is predicting another "above-normal Atlantic hurricane season" in 2021. Forecasters predict a 60% chance of an above-normal season, a 30% chance of a near-normal season, and a 10% chance of below-normal season. For 2021, a likely range of 13 to 20 named storms (winds of 39 mph or higher), of which 6 to 10 could become hurricanes (winds of 74 mph or higher), including 3 to 5 major hurricanes (category 3, 4 or 5, with winds of 111 mph or higher) is expected. NOAA provides these ranges with a 70% chance of confidence.



In the event of a hurricane, people can be seriously injured, or sometimes killed, and property damages can run into millions of dollars. Just think - If a hurricane headed toward Houston tomorrow, would <u>you</u> be prepared? It is a good idea to keep an adequate supply of disaster supplies on hand, including flashlights, candles, matches, portable or battery operated radio, first aid kit, emergency food and water, essential medicines, cash and credit cards, and a non-electric can opener. Have a plan of action and listen to local emergency officials on TV and radio (KTRH-AM 740 is the designated Emergency Alert Station for Houston) for the latest information.

The Harris County **Office of Emergency Management (OEM)** has the job of preparing Harris County and its residents to respond to and recover from the effects of disasters and emergencies, such as hurricanes. Please join us at the **June 21st Shepherd Forest Civic Club** meeting to hear a representative from the OEM discuss the 2021 Hurricane Season and how we should be prepared. HURRICANE EVACUATION HELP – DIAL 211

City and County leaders have launched a new emphasis on registering qualified citizens for assistance during emergency evacuations, such as hurricanes. Residents who are either elderly, homebound, disabled or without means of transportation in the event of an emergency evacuation, can sign up for this free program.

The information is passed to the City so that it can provide area residents adequate transportation in the event of an emergency situation. Pre-registering on the 211 system helps identify those who need assistance as well as what kind of assistance they might require

BIG BOX CLEAN UP

Houston City Council recently passed permitting and enforcement regulations for large donation boxes to help protect neighborhoods from safety hazards



and illegal dumping. Donation boxes, often the size of small dumpsters, were previously unregulated and can turn into eyesores and illegal dumping sites. The new ordinance requires owners of the boxes to obtain a permit and be responsible for maintaining and cleaning up the boxes and their contents.

POOLS OPEN SOON

Starting June 15, the City of Houston will open 10 outdoor pools for recreational swimming across the City, one in each City Council district, (except for Alief as that site is currently under renovation). The

remaining 27 City operated pools will be opened based on available staffing beginning on the target date of July 6, 2021.



Regular summer operating hours for public pools are Tuesday – Sunday from 1:00 pm to 8:00 pm. All pools are closed on Mondays.

City pools will only be open for *recreational* swimming. Summer pool programs, such as swimming lessons and water fitness, are currently scheduled to resume in the summer of 2022.


