Crime Stoppers Director of Victim Services Andy Kahan, will be the guest speaker at our upcoming civic club meeting on Monday, September 20<sup>th</sup> to discuss the alarming rise in crime in Houston. Mr. Kahan has done extensive research & much investigation into the ramifications of recent bail reform in Harris County & how that has played a role in our skyrocketing crime.



A **coyote** has been recently sighted in Section 2 (between Oak Forest and East TC Jester) roaming the streets & yards at various hours of the day and night. Watch out!






