CITY WATER BILLS TO INCREASE...... AGAIN !

Houston Public Works sent notices to customers this week explaining that water rates will increase by 9.2% beginning on April 1st. This is an automatic adjustment that occurs every year based on inflation. And added to that is the water rate increase approved by Houston City Council in June 2021 that raises rates every year on April

1st over the next five years through 2026. These amounts do not include drainage and solid waste charges that are also on your water bill. City Ordinances require certain automatic annual adjustments to the water and wastewater rates based on inflationary indices. The one-year inflationary index for our area is 8.2%. The City of Houston population increased by 1%. The inflationary index of 8.2%, when combined with the population increase of 1%, resulted in an automatic annual water and wastewater **rate increase of 9.2% on April 1, 2023.** This year, in addition to the 9.2% automatic annual rate adjustment, Ordinance No. 2021-515 adopted the 2022 Water & Wastewater Cost of Service Rate Study, which allows for **new annual rates over a 5- year period**. The City says that the new rate increase will help cover maintenance of water and wastewater infrastructure, reduce water main breaks, reduce sanitary sewer overflows, and provide resources to continue water and wastewater services. SHEPHERD FOREST SECURITY REPORT

Theft from vehicles, and assaults, seem to be on the rise around our neighborhood, according to HPD reports. If you are not familiar with the locations that seem to have the most problems, the 3000 block of Ella is the first block north of Loop 610 and the 3300 block of Ella is at West 34th. The 1100 block of W. 34th is at Alba and the 2000 block of W. 34th is across from Waltrip High School.

If something or someone looks suspicious to you, please report it to HPD immediately, regardless of how insignificant it may seem to you at the time.

Did you know that parking any vehicle on the grass (or any other non paved surface) in Shepherd Forest is **ILLEGAL?** The Prohibited Yard Parking Program is intended to protect neighborhood property values, prevent damage to the City of Houston's underground infrastructure, and to stop the degradation of the aesthetic appearance of single-family residential areas. Parking of vehicles on any unimproved surface in the front or side yards in residential neighborhoods is prohibited in areas where a Prohibited Yard Parking Requirement Area was adopted and Shepherd Forest opted into the program several years ago. Any person who violates the Prohibited Yard Parking Requirement Area shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined up to \$150 each day a violation occurs. You can report these violations by calling 311 or using the 311 app on your smart phone. Be sure to state that Shepherd Forest is included in the ordinance. This applies to any vehicle (including trailers) parked on a non-paved surface. Junk or abandoned vehicles may also be reported to the City by calling 311 or by using the 311 app.

News You Can Use

The new owner of the recently closed Don Teo's Mexican Restaurant property spoke with Civic Club officials last week and gave them the latest information



about his plans for a new coffee shop at that location. Plans currently include doing an extensive remodel on the inside of the

building, as well as plans to add an outdoor patio and drive thru for the new place soon to be called CoCo's DoNuts and Coffee Bar. The coffee shop will feature a variety of specialty and gourmet coffees, an espresso bar, pastries, donuts, and an Executive pastry chef to pull it all together. If all goes well, plans currently call for the coffee bar to open within 3 to 4 months.

Construction has apparently begun on the Marigny Heights townhome development which is being built on the south end of Oak Forest at Ansbury. Huge piles of

dirt and lots of machinery moving it around was most of the activity last week. Calls to the developer from the civic club have not been



returned, but as soon as we have news on the proposed 70 unit development, we will keep you informed.

At last check, construction on The Rosslyn, a luxury apartment project on 34th near Alba, is finally coming to a close. The development will have nearly 400 rental units and parking for 560 vehicles. The target date for construction completion and move in is September 2023.

Houston City Council voted last October to approve and adopt a redistricting plan that will establish new boundaries of single-member City Council districts



effective January 2024. This will allow prospective City Council candidates to verify residency eligibility to run in a single-member district before the November 2023 General

Election filing period. The new district boundaries will be used for the purpose of electing District Council Members at the City General Election to be held on November 7, 2023, and will go into effect for terms of office beginning on January 2, 2024. Currently, Shepherd Forest residents living in Sections 1 and 2 - east of White Oak Bayou - are in City Council District C (Abbie Kamin). Those residents living in Section 3 - west of White Oak Bayou – are currently in District A (Amy Peck). For more info visit https://www.letstalkhouston.org/redistricting
