## CITY'S RECOMMENDED SOCIAL DISTANCING **GUIDANCE FOR ALL HOUSTONIANS**

The Houston Health Department has broadened its COVID-19 social distancing guidance for the general public. The department now recommends all Houstonians stay away from groups of 10 or more people where there will be close contact with others. The City also recommends:

- Maintain at least 6 feet of separation from other people.
- Avoid eating or drinking in bars, restaurants, and food courts use drive-thru, pickup, or delivery
- Avoid discretionary travel, shopping trips, and social visits.
- · Do not visit nursing homes or retirement or long-term care facilities unless to provide critical care
- Practice healthy hygiene habits:
- Wash hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use hand sanitizer when you can't wash your hands.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue and throw the tissue away. If you don't have a tissue, use the elbow of your sleeve. Don't use your hands to cover coughs and sneezes.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick, especially if you are at higher risk for coronavirus.
- Get plenty of rest, drink plenty of fluids, eat healthy foods, and manage your stress to keep your immunity strong.
- Work or engage in schooling from home whenever possible.
- Stay informed. Visit https://houstonrecovers.org/covid19 for frequently changing updates.

#### People at higher risk include:

- People 60 and older.
- · People with underlying health conditions including heart disease, lung disease, or diabetes.
- People who have weakened immune systems.
- Pregnant women.
