Shepherd Forest will be getting some new neighbors in the Brookhollow Marketplace which is being built on the property of the recently demolished Exxon campus on Dacoma near Hwy. 290. Construction began late last year and negotiations are underway for the remaining space. Developer Fidelis Realty plans to turn over spaces to tenants for build-out during the summer and stores will open this fall.



BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR!

Just doing a few simple things can make the difference in being a good neighbor. Put yourself in your neighbors position and consider how you would feel if you were treated as you treat them.







Some of the issues we continue to hear about are as follows:

- Scoop Your Poop! Pet owners are reminded to pick up after their pet especially in neighbors yards. Carry a plastic bag with you when you walk your pet, and let's keep our beautiful neighborhood clean!
- Keep Your Curb Clean Don't forget to keep your curb free of leaves, trash, newspapers, and other debris as it will end up stopping up our drains and eventually flow into our waterways. We have a limited number of storm drains in Shepherd Forest, so lets keep them clean and prevent unnecessary flooding issues. Every home should help with this issue, not just those near drains.
- Do Not Block Garbage Cans On scheduled garbage/recycle pick up days, please do not park on the street where you are blocking garbage cans. If the garbage pickup drivers are not able to reach the garbage cans, they will pass by without emptying them....and you will have an unhappy neighbor left with a full can of garbage!
- Keep Barking Dogs Quiet If you are the owner of a dog who loves to go in the backyard and bark at the wind or a passing bird, please keep them quiet. Barking dogs can be a great alarm system, but endless barking for no reason is a nuisance to everyone.
- Park Respectfully Our streets are filled with cars parked along the curbs. When parking your vehicle, please respect your neighbors and don't park in an area that makes it hard for them to enter or exit their driveway. Moving just a few feet can make a huge difference.
