The most common crime we see in Shepherd Forest is theft. Theft is a crime of opportunity - if we don't give thieves the opportunity, they can't commit this crime. That said, please keep in mind the following precautions:

Be always aware of your surroundings. When your guard is down or you are distracted, a thief can snatch your purse, pick your pocket, or physically harm you to take your wallet and valuables. Put the phone down and pay attention to what is happening around you.

Theft from a vehicle is probably the most common crime we report here. ALWAYS lock your car when it is in your driveway or in front of your house. NEVER leave valuables in your car, even if they are concealed. If you do become a victim, ALWAYS report it to HPD.
