Citizens Patrol Security Report

Another short list of reported crimes since the last Newsletter ... but activity in nearby subdivisions has picked up with recent reports in Timbergrove, Oak Forest and Garden Oaks of a team of young males who are traveling together, late at night, and checking all driveways for unlocked cars and rifling through the contents. Video from surveillance cameras has been shared on Facebook and NextDoor in the hopes that someone will recognized these youths. Cars and trucks are still a popular target.

In the aftermath of Hurricane Harvey, there will be any number of strangers passing through our area with the intention of picking through and taking whatever they can scavenge from storm debris. In their search for items to take, they may not restrict themselves to the moldy items left at the curb. It is more important than ever that you keep your homes and cars locked and secure.

Report all crime to HPD. Citizens Patrol reminds us to **call HPD (911 if it is an emergency, or 713-884-3131) if you should see anything or anyone that appears to be "suspicious,"** *AFTER* **you have made the call to HPD, notify our Citizens Patrol by reporting it to our new COP Coordinator Debby Fisher 434-221-6222.**

BEWARE OF FRAUD - HURRICANES ALSO BRING STORM CHASERS

Both FEMA and the Texas Attorney General's Office are warning citizens of the risk of fraud and common scams in the wake of severe weather. Common post-disaster fraud practices include phony housing inspectors, fraudulent building contractors, bogus pleas for disaster donations, and false offers of state or federal aid. Texas are urged to ask questions, and to require identification when someone claims to represent a government agency.

Also keep in mind that state and federal workers never ask for or accept money, and always carry identification badges. There is no fee required to apply for or to receive disaster assistance from FEMA, the US Small Business Administration or the state. No state or government disaster assistance agency will call to ask for your financial information. Unless you place a call to these agencies, you should not provide personal information over the phone as it can lead to identity theft.

Bring Your Green Recycling Bin Back To Your House!



Recycling, Yard, Junk, And Tree Waste Collection Curbside single stream recycling collection, yard, junk, and tree waste collections will be suspended until further notice due to the need of extra personnel for debris collection related to disaster recovery. If you have storm debris in front of your house, The City of Houston Solid Waste Management Department is asking residents to **remove all parked vehicles from the streets when debris crews are working in your neighborhoo**d. If heavy trucks are unable to pass safely along the streets, the City will not be able to remove the debris. Storm debris will be collected on an ongoing basis until further notice.
