ELECTION NEWS FOR RESIDENTS

Election day is Tuesday, November 3rd and your vote is important! Information related to mail-in ballots, early voting, and election day voting can be found at www.harrisvotes.com or by calling 713-755-6965. Even if you did not vote in the Primary or Run-Off Elections earlier this year, all registered qualified voters may vote on Election Day. Unfortunately, if you haven't previously registered to vote, the deadline has already passed.

MAIL-IN BALLOT INFORMATION:

The last day to apply for a mail-in ballot for those who qualify is October 23rd. This is the date that the county clerk must receive your application (not postmarked by). You can request a ballot by mail online www.harrisvotes.com or by calling the Harris County Clerk's Election Division 713-755-6965. If you do plan to vote by mail, please mail it back as soon as possible. You can now track your mail-in ballot at: www.harrisvotes.com/tracking. If you choose to drop your mail-in ballot off in person at NRG Center - 8825 Kirby Drive, bring your photo ID as only the person whose name appears on the ballot may drop it off.

EARLY VOTING:

Early voting in Harris County began on Tuesday, October 13th and runs through Friday, October 30th. You may vote at any Early Voting polling location in Harris County. Currently on weekdays and Saturdays, the early voting polls are open from 7am to 7pm, and on Sundays from noon to 7pm. From Oct 27th-29th the hours change to 7am to 10pm, then back to 7am to 7pm on October 30th. Early Voting polling places near Shepherd Forest are:

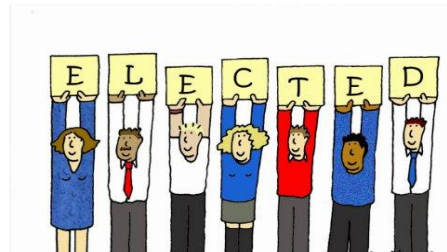
The Presidential Election on Tuesday, November 3rd is a very important election and every vote will count. Don't miss the opportunity to let your voice be heard. Please vote !

CITIZENS ON PATROL SECURITY REPORT

Although crime in Shepherd Forest seems to be about the same as last month, crime on major streets in and around SF has been increasing each month. Once again, the area near Loop 610 and Ella seems to be a “hot spot” for various crime. For reporting purposes, the 1900 block of North Loop 610 and the 3000 block of Ella Blvd is the area “generally located at the intersection of Loop 610 and Ella Blvd.” Please be extra aware and on alert when you are in these areas as crime has been occurring at various times of the day and night. HPD reported incidents that SFCC has been made aware of include:

In addition to those crimes listed above, SF residents reported that a shooting took place recently near the CVS/Lowes area at Loop 610/Ella, as well as an assault in the parking lot at CVS a week later. Both incidents occurred on a weekend in the middle of the busy afternoon. At the time of printing of this newsletter, HPD had not yet released information about either of these incidents. RESIDENTS CHEER AS PARADE PASSES

After National Night Out festivities were cancelled due to CoVid19, the SF Civic Club decided to host a parade through the neighborhood to bring awareness to our Citizens on Patrol organization and crime prevention in Shepherd Forest. If you missed all the sirens, horns honking, and cheering, you really missed a great parade. Led and escorted by representatives from the Houston Police Department, Civic Club officials and members of the SFCC Citizens on Patrol drove their vehicles through all three sections of the neighborhood. Many residents came outside to wave and clap or gather curbside with family and friends, while others took pictures as the parade passed by.

HIGH WATER AND DRAINAGE PROJECT

Recent rain events again brought flooded streets to parts of Shepherd Forest. Should high-water situations occur in your immediate area, we urge you to report any street and/or any structure flooding to 3-1-1. This is the only way that the City will be made aware of the flooding, so PLEASE notify the City when water gets high. After the recent storms/rain events experienced in Shepherd Forest, a check with the City's 311 system revealed that there had been not even one call received regarding flooding of streets in Section 2. As far as the City knew, there had been no water in the streets. And those living near Piney Woods in Section 2 were very aware of how high and fast the water came up over the curbs and flooded our streets. So PLEASE report any street/structure flooding in SF to 311 and help get the City's attention to address the drainage problems in your area.

In Section 3, the City of Houston Gardendale Drainage Rehabilitation Project is well underway. The existing 18" storm sewer lines on Gardendale are being replaced with 24" lines to take more water runoff under West TC Jester and east into White Oak Bayou. In addition, the existing storm sewer inlets are also being enlarged. Hopefully, this will alleviate the flooding issues that residents in this area have been facing for a number of years.

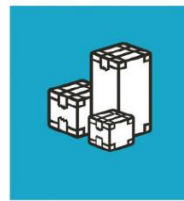
