## NEWS YOU CAN USE....

Everyone with City of Houston garbage collection also has automated curbside recycling in the big green 96-gal cart. But are you aware of the basics of recycling? Do you know what can and cannot be recycled? Where to properly place your cart for pickup? On **Monday, August 21st**, the Shepherd Forest Civic Club will host a meeting with representatives from the City's Solid Waste/Recycling Department to learn more about the basics of recycling. In addition, for those not sure what can be tossed in the green bins, we'll even have a special "show and tell" segment where residents can show items that they aren't sure are recyclable, and our specialist will tell you the answer! So be on the lookout for items that you are not sure can be placed in the recycle bins and have them with you at the meeting. Recycle representatives can also give you the answer to any other questions you may have relating to the City of Houston Recycling Program.

## TES! Put these in your recycling cart.

- \*Metal and Cans: Aluminum & Tins Cans. Examples: Soup and vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed)
- \***Cartons:** Both table top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- \*Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- \*Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- \*Cardboard: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- \*Plastic: Bottles, tubs and jugs #1-5 and #7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles (emptied and rinsed)

## **NO! DO NOT** put these in your recycling cart.



Do NOT put the following in your GREEN RECYCLING container: Batteries/Electronics; Shredded Paper, Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing), Food or Liquids, Pizza boxes, Trash and Bagged Recycling, Furniture and Household Goods, Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks), Yard Waste of any kind
