



Citizens Patrol Security Report



On Monday, March 21 Constable Alan Rosen visited our Civic Club meeting to discuss safety in our neighborhood. He noted that on that very day, an alert neighbor in the 900 block of 31st street was able to thwart the burglary of the house next to hers. As she reported the crime in progress, HPD and constables were able to apprehend the 3 young adult males who were burglarizing the house, and recovered items linked to 3 additional burglaries. Constable Rosen advised us that keeping our homes and our property safe should be an ongoing effort. Always lock your doors and windows. Keep bushes and landscaping low to prevent anyone from hiding. Exterior lighting all around you house will discourage thieves from lingering around. Be aware of strangers around you at all times, but especially when you are leaving an ATM with cash, or a busy store where you may have received cash back from your purchase.

If you observe suspicious behavior of any kind – strangers lingering in the neighborhood without a purpose, or door-to-door solicitors that become persistent, aggressive or belligerent – HPD strongly advises submitting an Alert Slip, which you can do on line at http://www.houstontx.gov/police/alert_slip/. Constable Rosen told us that these slips are discussed at the beginning of every patrol shift and the areas that submit more slips will receive more attention. Beginning with the April Civic Club meeting, we will also be making these slips available there.

No matter how minor something might seem, please take a moment to report it to HPD. You can do this easily on line at http://www.houstontx.gov/police/online_report.htm. Then go to the Shepherd Forest Facebook page and share the information there, and/or www.Nextdoor.com to let your neighbors know that this is happening on your street or in your section.

Citizens Patrol reminds us to **call HPD (911 if it is an emergency, or 713-884-3131) if you should see anything or anyone that appears to be “suspicious,”** regardless of how insignificant it may seem. Then, *AFTER* you have made the call to HPD, notify our Citizens Patrol by reporting it to David Hille 713-551-1350 so that our patrollers will also be advised of “hot spot” areas or descriptions of people/vehicles.

AND ... We still need a COP Security Coordinator. Would you be willing to serve for just one year? A single 12-month commitment would help this program get back on its feet. Contact any Civic Club officer or board member for details.

Section	Garbage	Recycling (no glass)	Tree Waste	Junk Waste/ Heavy Trash
1 & 2	Tuesdays	Alternate Tuesdays	3rd Thursdays of Odd Months May 19 July 21	3rd Thursdays of Even Months June 16 August 18
3	Thursdays	Alternate Thursdays	4th Tuesday of Odd Months May 24 July 26	4th Tuesday of Even Months June 24 August 23

In case you haven't heard, **GLASS is no longer accepted in your big green bins used for recycling.** To recycle your glass, your nearest Neighborhood Depository/Recycling Centers are:
